
of famous people to make fun of them, but you can do yours for enjoyment!

CLAUDE MONET (1840 – 1926)




CARICATURE




Step 2. Practice enlarging and changing

Claude Monet always enjoyed drawing when he was at school in France. This is when he started to draw caricatures. He also liked to paint outdoors. He traveled a great deal, always taking his paints with him.

Later, Monet became part of a group of French painters called Impressionists. He used paint to capture the way light played on landscapes and buildings.



Step 3. Choose what you are going to exaggerate and then draw the caricature. Can you still tell who it is meant to be? You can add a small body like Monet did if you like.
