Colored Paper  
Black Felt Pen  
Scissors • Glue  
Pencils • Paint  
Paintbrush



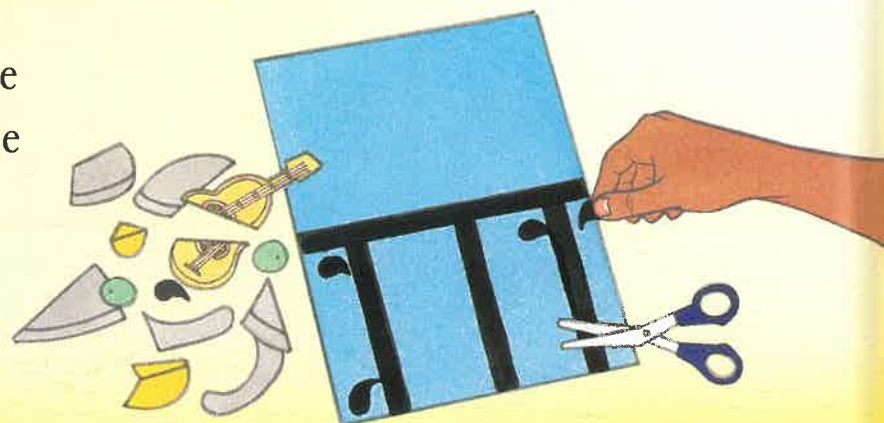
## PROJECT: CUBIST COLLAGE

**Step 1.** Use the objects in Picasso's picture or some you have chosen yourself. Draw them onto colored paper using a black felt pen.



**Step 2.** Draw and paint a background of a window onto a piece of cardboard. This will frame your image.

**Step 3.** Cut up the objects you have drawn using straight lines. Arrange them onto the background and glue them in place when you are happy with how it looks.
