SCIENCE & SOCIAL STUD

ROOM 4

2023

In our Science studies, we'll be taking a virtual time travel trip as we explore what life was like before humans existed and the ways in which certain species (animals, plants, etc.) faced extinction. To complement these studies, we'll visit the Auckland Zoo and the Auckland War Memorial Museum. In Social Studies, the students will "play" *Where in Aoteroa is Carmen Sandiego?*, based on the popular video game and television series. They'll uncover clues as to the whereabouts of Carmen Sandiego as she 'travels' New Zealand. They'll then become "Video Tour Guides" to introduce viewers to the different regions of Aotearoa New Zealand.

TECHNOLOGY

Miss K's class consistently engages in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Maths) group challenges, such as designing and building *Spaghetti Towers*. We'll not only complete several fun and educational STEM challenges, but we'll also create Stop Frame Animation projects with Lego and cameras/tablets.

STUDENT-DRIVEN LEARNING

I am adapting Room 4's afternoon programme to provide opportunities for student-driven learning at various "learning centres" set up in the classroom. Each week, students will choose their weekly learning focus from a selection of high-interest and hands-on learning experiences that incorporate maths, the arts, finance, coding, culinary arts, career studies, writing, and hard materials (i.e., woodwork and construction).
